How a country gets what it needs . . .



### **ECONOMIC SYSTEM**

the way in which people decide to organize the production, distribution, and consumption of goods and services

The three basic <u>questions</u> that every economic system must <u>answer</u> are:

1. Production: What will be made? ex. cars, airplanes, oil, corn, computers



The three basic questions every economic system must answer are:

2. <u>Distribution:</u> How will it be made? What <u>resources</u> will be used?

ex. machines, assembly lines, individual skilled workers; oil, trees, iremanded workers, iremanded worke



The three basic questions that every economic system must answer are:

3. Consumption: For whom will it be made? ex. everyday shoppers, the government, consumers in foreign countries





# Every society answers the three basic questions in different ways. So they have different economic systems or economies

- 1. Command Economy
  - 2. Market Economy
- 3. Traditional Economy

### COMMAND ECONOMY

the government makes decisions about what, how, and for whom to produce

### **MARKET ECONOMY**

Everyday people (producers & consumers) make the decisions about what, how, and for whom to produce



### TRADITIONAL ECONOMY

Social roles & culture (traditions) determine what, how, and for whom to produce

People do the same things their ancestors did before them

### Traditional Economy EXAMPLES

- You're a girl. Your mom spins thread & makes cloth, so you do too
- Your parents raise & herd cattle, so you do too.
- A families status in the community may determine if they can own a tractor
