

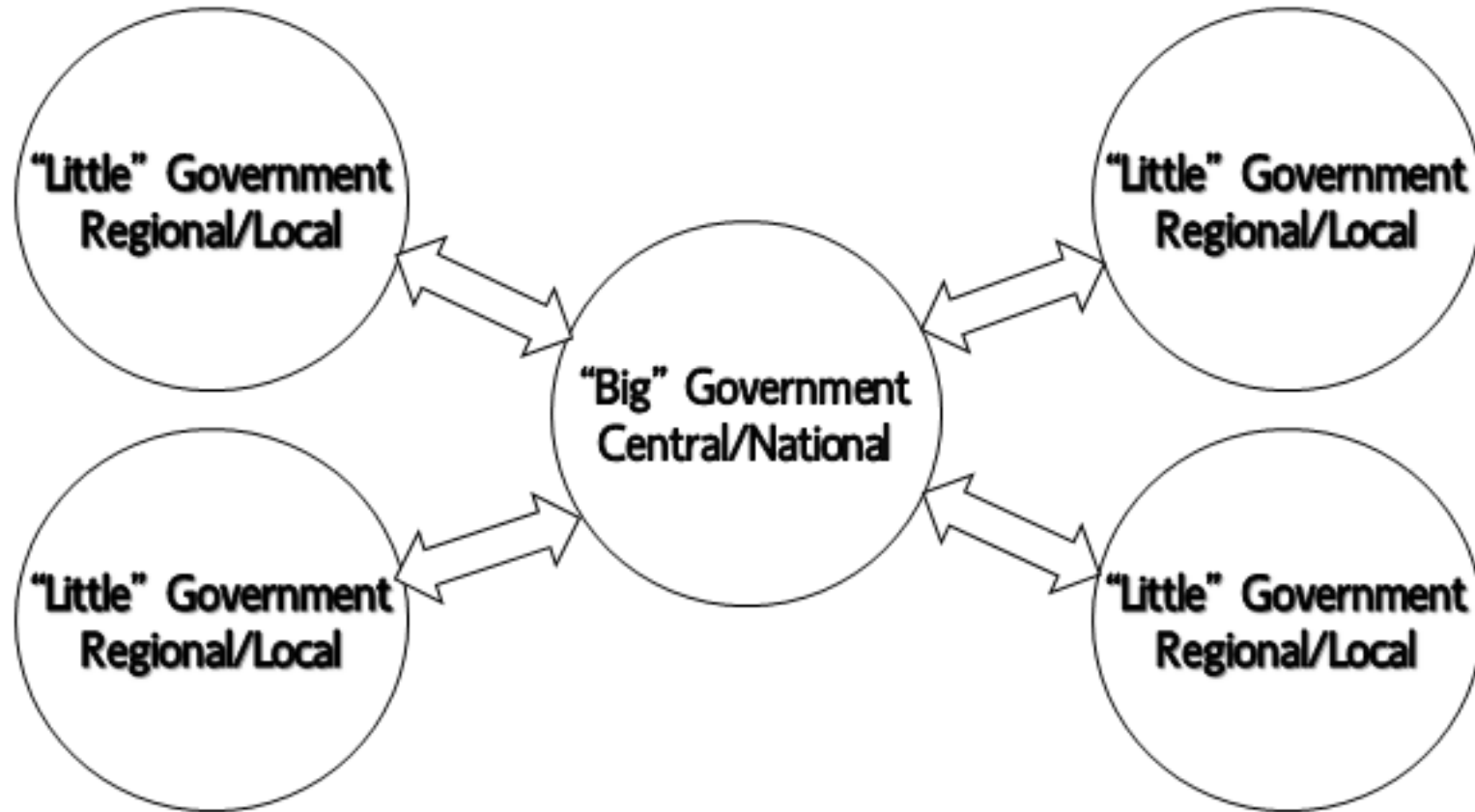

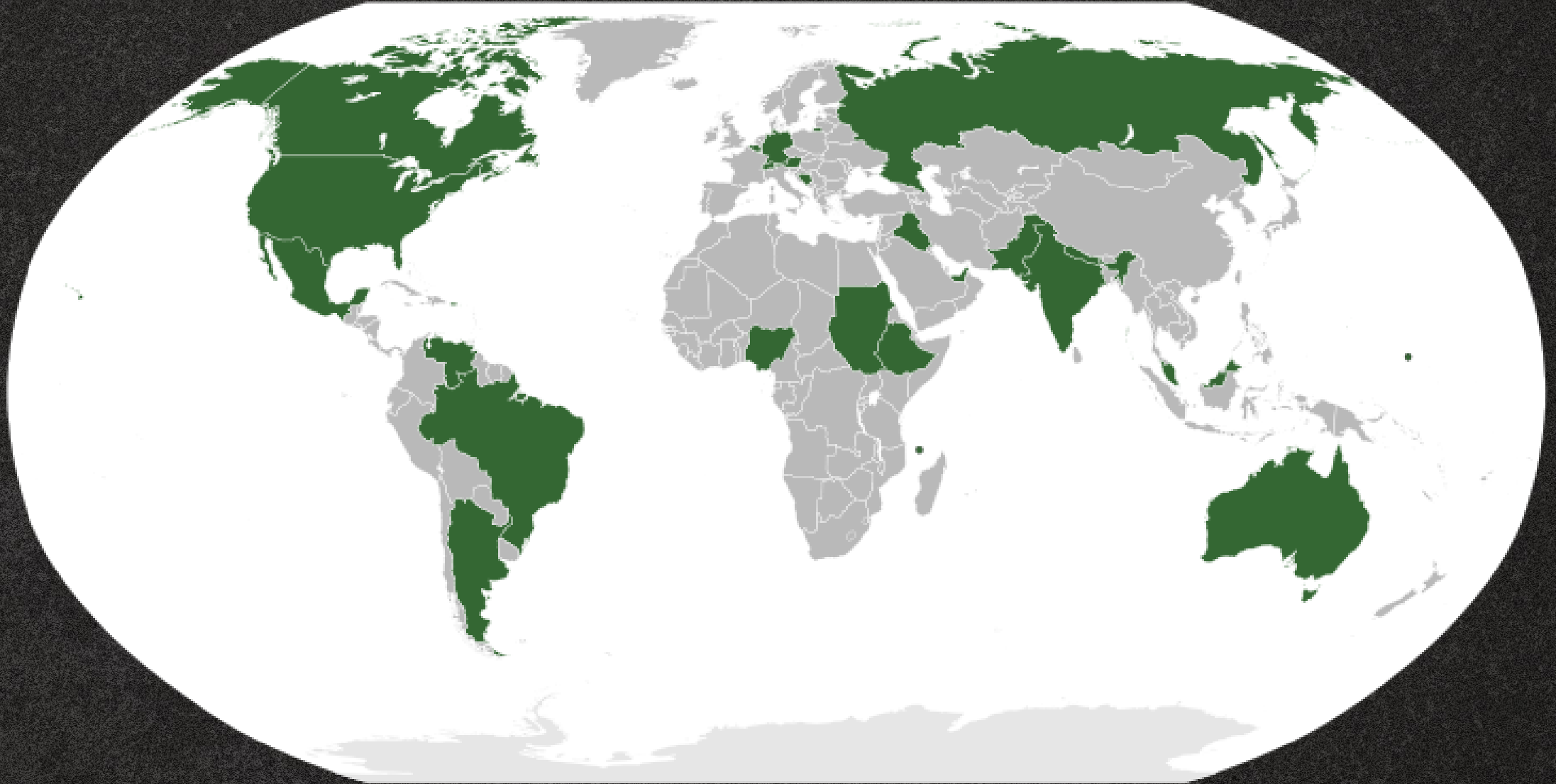
## Central Power=Local Power


- Power is shared by a powerful central government and the state or local governments.

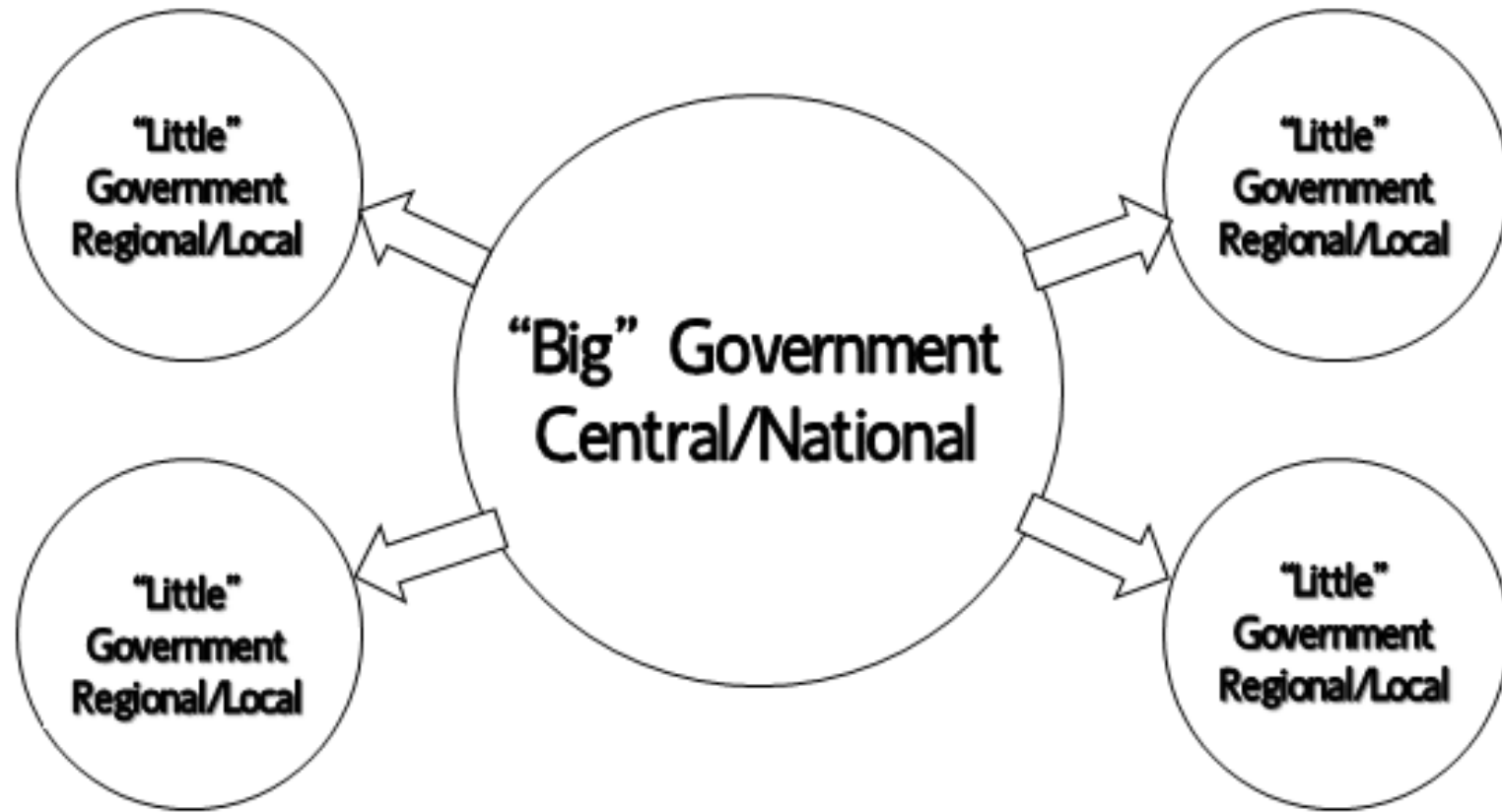

# Unitary System

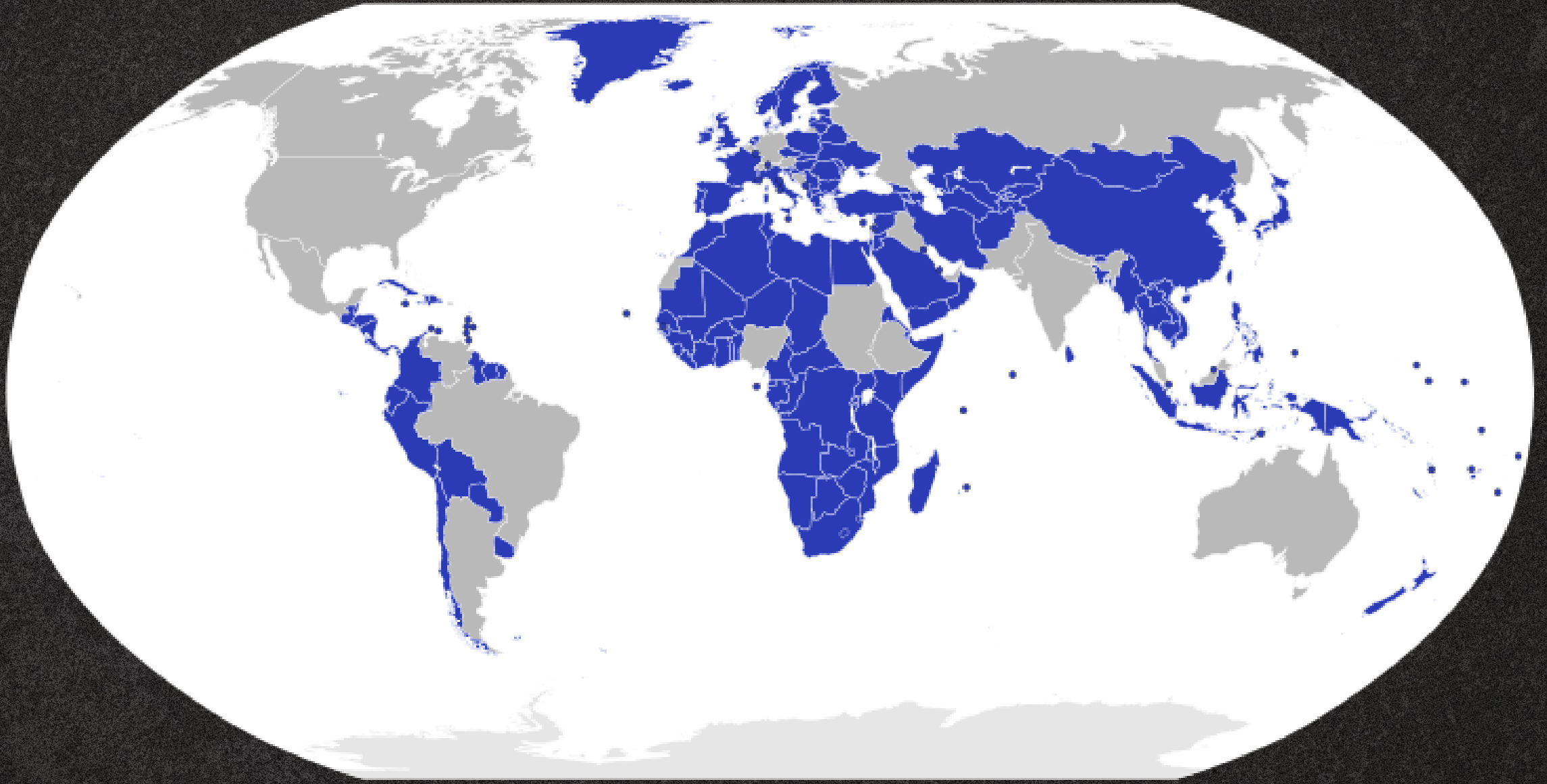
Central Power > Regional Power


- Power is held by one central authority.

Central Power < Regional Power

- Power is SHARED by an ALLIANCE of independent states.
- They voluntarily COME together for some common purpose and AGREE to certain limits on their freedom of action.
- Confederations generally have a weak CENTRAL government.
